Requirements and Benefits of the Homeschool Connections College Credit Partnership with Franciscan University of Steubenville (FUS)

***Note: Recorded courses are not eligible for college credit.

Student requirements:

- Enroll **both** with Homeschool Connections at https://caravel.homeschoolconnections.com/catalog and with the Franciscan Advantage program. FUS will bill their fee separately.
- The cost is \$100 per credit billed by FUS, in addition to normal Homeschool Connections fees paid at registration. Most courses are 3 credits for the two-semesters. Chemistry with Lab is 4 credits.

- Complete the FUS online application: https://franciscan.tfaforms.net/217883
- Students must be 16 years old by the date of the course final exam. **Parents should** confirm this date with FUS.
- Must be a high school junior or senior
- Must have at least 2.4 cumulative GPA (self-reported, transcript not required)
- Students will have a login to access study resources on the FUS system.
 *** Before the midterm exam in early January, download the Respondus Lockdown Browser. (It does not work on Chromebooks.) Two-factor identification will be required for exams.
- Take the online midterm (40% of grade) and final (60% of grade) exams from the equivalent FUS course. The exam grades will be averaged together for the FUS course grade. Students will also receive a Homeschool Connections grade as usual.

Student benefits:

- 90% tuition discount from the on-campus rate
- Official FUS transcript for the course
- \$2000/year scholarship for each of four years, if accepted to FUS after passing just one Advantage Program course
- Automatic acceptance to FUS if the student takes three or more Advantage courses, with a 3.0 GPA for those courses
- 100% refund of FUS fees (HSC refunds are distinct) with no transcript record if the course is dropped by Jan. 22, which is after the midterm exam. Parents should confirm this date with FUS.
- Option to retake an Advantage Program course on campus and have the earlier grade dropped from the transcript
